3rd Sunday of Easter



Today's gospel is the story of the last appearance of the risen Jesus in the gospel of John. It is unusual in that the events seem to take place not in the immediate aftermath of Easter but at some unspecified later period. The disciples seem uninspired and indeed

uninspiring. All this changes through the presence of Christ. Suddenly their work is fruitful and now they are around him again as a community, receiving nourishment from him as their Bread of Life.

This post-Resurrection appearance of Jesus reminds us of an earlier incident in his ministry, namely the call of Peter and the other disciples after their night of fishing in the Sea of Galilee. In both instances, Jesus asks the disciples to cast their nets into the sea a second time. In both cases they catch a large number of fish, and in both incidents Jesus invites Peter to follow him. "The Fathers and Doctors of the Church have often dwelt on the mystical meaning of this episode: **the boat is the Church**, whose unity is symbolized by the net which is not torn; **the sea is the world**, **Peter in the boat stands for supreme authority of the Church**, and **the number of fish signifies the number of the elect** (*The Navarre Bible: Text and Commentaries*).

However, the primary purposes in recounting this appearance of the Risen Christ to his Apostles were to rehabilitate Peter who standing beside a charcoal fire, denied three times that he even knew Jesus. Now again beside a charcoal fire, Peter is given the opportunity to be fully reconciled to his Master and to tell him that he does indeed love him and to receive from Jesus his mission to care for the flock stressing the actual conferring of Primacy in the Church on Peter. This gospel is a reminder to us that without a living faith in the presence of Christ the church could easily become just another religious institution. To know our true identity as the People of God we must be open to hearing Jesus' question and to observing his command: 'Do you love me? ... then feed my sheep.'


