
The Solemnity of The Blessed Trinity

On the feast of the Most Holy Trinity the church invites us to reflect on the central and most unfathomable mystery of that faith, which she has been sent to announce and make present: the mystery of who God is. In our practice of Christian Life, the Trinity is remembered often in prayer and during the daily routine by every Christian. Each time we make the sign of the cross, as we did at the beginning of this celebration, we say: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The Holy Trinity is the mystery of God in himself - a God who is "one but not solitary" as a fourthcentury Creed says. Through Christ and his Holy Spirit, we have come to know that in God there are three Persons, each is totally God, and the sole distinction between them is their respective relationship in functionality. Even though we remember the Trinity several times a day, as we invoke its presence before we begin any activity, yet it is difficult to comprehend the full meaning because the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit we invoke constitute a great Mystery.

Our God is a Trinity, a God of love and forgiveness. In the Gospel of today Jesus commend his disciples to the Spirit who will make everything lucid by which the disciples will be commissioned to carry on Christ's mission to all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. In the first reading the functionality of the Trinity is expressed as God (The Father) created through his Wisdom (Christ) who settled the chaos of existence by the orderly hand of His love (The Holy Spirit). Together all came to the delight of men who enjoy his countless Blessings. How awesome is this bond of Love, how excellent in his ways and we sing with the psalmist "How great is your name, o Lord our God through all the earth".

By our union with Christ, we are taken up into the family of the Holy Trinity. May we all be united in love as the father is with the son and the holy spirit. Happy Trinity Sunday and Happy Father's Day!!
