Solemnity of Corpus Christi



Today, we celebrate the solemn feast of *Corpus Christi*. It is a doctrinal feast established for three purposes: 1) to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to honor Him there; 2) to instruct the people in the Mys-

tery, Faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist, and 3) to teach us to appreciate and make use of the great gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as a Sacrament and as a sacrifice.

Corpus Christi is three feasts in one: the feast of the Eucharistic sacrifice, the feast of the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the feast of the Real Presence of Jesus in this Sacrament. In today's feast, we celebrate Christ's gift of himself to us in the Eucharist, the source and summit of our life.

Christ gave the church this sacrament in order to remain forever in the Church (Matthew 28:20), to grant eternal life (Jn. 6:53-54) and to give this life in full (Jn 10:10). So in the Holy Eucharist, Christ provides a visible means of communicating this life to us so that we can be *fully alive both in this world and in the next*.

This feast reminds us of this great gift of Christ and demands of our worthy reception and adoration of the Holy Eucharist. To receive Christ in the holy Eucharist, we must be in the state of grace. However, it doesn't end in the reception, we need to adore Christ in the holy Eucharist as St Augustine affirmed "No one eats that flesh without first adoring it; we should sin were we not to adore it." ('Enarrationes in Psalmos,' 98,9)

As we celebrate this Feast 'Corpus Christi, we ask God to increase our faith and to help us to be transformed more like him as we receive and adore his Body and Blood. Happy Feast day!!
