20th Sunday Reflection



In the recent days, there have been much tension in the world. Countries waging wars, revolutions and protests. Even, the church is not spared from this pickle. In fact, the church has been on the news and still under the watch of the media.

The recent happenings caused by "those entrusted to care for the flock" whose life styles fall short of the true gospel values have challenged her credibility. These situations were caused either by rejection, betrayal or denial of the true values of the gospel of Christ. In the face of these turbulences, Christ prophetic pronouncement in the gospel reading today could be understood. Thus, today readings bring to light the fallouts of Christ's message and mission.

Jesus makes it stirringly clear that his message and mission will bring division. Thus, he says "Do you suppose that I am here to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division" (Lk 12:51). This could be seen in the fate of Jeremiah in the first reading. Jeremiah opposed the pro-Egypt policy of powerful advisers of the King Zedekiah who sought to gain complete independence for Judah by playing off one leading power (Egypt) against another (Babylon). With prophetic insight Jeremiah saw that this would lead to the destruction of the kingdom at the hands of the Babylonians (which in fact it did). He urged Zedekiah to preserve the nation by coming to terms with the Babylonian king and paying tribute. Adopting this unpopular stance led to his being thrown into the well and left to die there, as described in the reading. In its real sense, Jeremiah's fate provides a prophetic precedent and context for Jesus' words in the Gospel (Lk 12:49-53). Ironically, however, while Jeremiah urged a "peace" policy (with the Babylonians), Jesus - provocatively - states that he has not come to bring peace but division. | Why? the simple answer is "light and darkness" are eternally in opposition.

We must try to understand what Christ mean by "division, separation and not bring peace". To do this, we must ask ourselves these fundamental questions: does the teaching of Christ ever disturb me? Does it cause me to question the way I'm living? Does it ever bring me into conflict with those who do not live by the Gospel? If it does not do so, it can only mean that I'm not really hearing it. Christ's teaching is like a sword that separates good from evil. It is like a fire that burns off the weeds and leaves the wheat. Let us reflect on this to see where we stand – with Christ or against Christ. Have a solemn Sunday.
