

21st Sunday Reflection

"Sir, will there be only a few saved? Dear friends, this question posed by an unnamed follower of Jesus refocuses Jesus teaching to the theme of Salvation which is the one thing that matters in our spiritual pursuits.

Jesus answers this question in his own way, from a broad vision of his mission as the messiah. He made known three facts that matters in relation to the salvation he has come to bring to all humanity. First, he reminds us that the door to salvation is narrow, so not all can easily enter for to be saved demands a lot of effort and struggles thus St Paul says "work out your salvation" (Philippians 2:12). Secondly, Jesus ruled out the idea that everyone will be saved. Although all have been called, it is only those who pass through this narrow gate will be saved. Thirdly, our mere cognizance of Jesus or our libs familiarity cannot gain us entrance for it is not those who call me Lord, Lord, will be saved but those who do the will of my father in heaven" (Matt 7:21). We must put into practice the teachings of Christ and do the will our father in heaven. For if we fail to do this, we may miss our goal.

The basic question that matters which everyone of us must ask is "Am I prepared to be saved, choosing the narrow gate of sacrificial love?" We need to make wise decisions for God allows us to decide every day what road we will walk down and what gate we will choose. He encourages us, however, to choose His way: "Choose life" (Dt 30:19-20); "Choose this day whom to serve" (Joshua 24:15); "If God is Lord, follow Him" (1 Kings 18:21) "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me" (Lk 9:23.) we are to strive to enter through the "narrow gate" by prayer and supplication, diligently seeking deliverance from those things which would bar our entrance and acquiring those things which would facilitate our entry. This demands daily examination of self in order to ascertain we are on the right track.

Let us understand that what matters is not how many that will be saved but am I to be saved? For although salvation, is Christ's gift to the whole world, only those who diligently following the right path by living as God commands will be saved. Salvation, a gift given to all demands a corresponding love action. To be saved, strive to go through the narrow gate.
