22nd Sunday Reflection

Dear friends in Christ, as we begin will Be this new month this Sunday, the Himself church draws our attention to the necessity of the virtue of humility in



our Christian life. This is very important as true humility is rare in this age of narcissism and self-idolatry. But what is humility? In its literary sense, humility is often thought to occur in the absence of pride. It is defined as the quality or condition of being humble, modest opinion or estimate of one's own importance, rank, position etc. As a word, it etymologically derived from the Latin word humilis meaning lowliness, which virtually comes from the Latin root word humus meaning the earth or soil. St Augustine sees humility as "the foundation of all the other virtues hence, in the soul in which this virtue does not exist, there cannot be any other virtue except in mere appearance".

The readings this Sunday lay much emphasis on true humility. The first reading points out clearly that the key to a successful fellowship with God and with others is humility. Thus, the preacher admonishes "My son, be gentle in carrying out your business, and you will be better loved than a lavish giver. The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly, and then you will find favour with the Lord" (Sirach 3:17,18). Christ in the gospel reading, taught the people using a parable on the need to be humble as important virtue that uplifts, saves from humiliation and exalts thus "for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted" (Lk 14:11, Matt 23:12).

We need true humility and to have it, we must be ready to lower ourselves and imitate Christ, who humbled himself and took our human nature (Phil 2.). True humility exalts as it takes off the false glory of the world which is pride. Pride is nothing but an ostentation of deprivation, it is often a cover-up for insecurity. Humility brings openness and such openness is attractive and wins more favours. It gives a solidity and authenticity which opens us to divine blessings and riches for "blessed are the humble in heart for they shall inherit the earth" (Matt 5:5). There is no doubt about it, humility is the foundation of the entire spiritual life for without it, we will never advance in holiness. Yet, humility is not simply an abstraction to be admired, it is a virtue to be learned and practiced through the often painful circumstances of our daily life. Be humble, for God exalts the humble and humbles the proud. Have a great Sunday.
