

SOLEMNITY OF ST MIRIN (Patron Saint of Paisley)

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the patron saint of the town of Paisley. It is an important celebration for us here in Paisley town on account of the great missionary work carried out here by this great saint who, as the most accepted legend holds; was

an Irish monk and missionary from Bangor, Ireland. He founded a religious community at St Mirin's Croft which grew to become Paisley Abbey. Mirin was of noble birth and educated under St Congal, at Bangor Monastery. He joined the brotherhood of monks eventually becoming Prior. Having met and been deeply impressed by St Finian, tutor of St Columba, he got close to St Columba and began corresponding with him on a regular basis.

Within the course of his missionary life, he left Bangor in 580AD and was appointed Missionary to the West of Scotland. Arriving in what is now the town of Paisley he preached and worked many miracles beside the banks of the Mirin burn, converting many to Christianity and set up his first church at Seedhill, to this day still a populous part of the town, in the Parish that bears his name. With the help of his four disciples, Barchanus, Malcomus, Petrus and Alanus, other churches were founded at Kilbarchan, Kilmacolm, Kilpeter and Kilallan (Houston). His preaching and great charisma attracted many people, including the prophet Merlin from Govan (Merlinford). After his death his shrine became a Centre of pilgrimage and he is referred to as the glorious confessor in many charters and Papal Bulls.

The readings today resonate the need for us to renew the missionary vigor we received through Baptism. Although, we may be weak and unworthy: as we live in an imperfect world, "among a people of unclean lips" (Isaiah 6:5) as Isaiah confessed but God's transformative touch changes the game. Our total surrender to God's will, surely will give the maximum output "for God do not call the perfect but perfects the called". If we can realize that we have been given a share of God grace (Eph.4:11) and respond with psalmist "Here I am Lord, I have come to do your will" (Psalm 40:2), God will surely work His mighty deed in us and through us as he did through his holy humble servant St Mirin.

Our lives should be filled with a real desire to make Jesus known, and our actions and our prayers, in this regard, will never be unwelcome when we act, not out of power or authority, but in perfect humility and in love. May we be inspired by St Mirin to live a holy life, in total humility and optimum dedication to God. May we be humble servants of God serving our community in love. St Mirin, patron Saint of Paisley and glorious confessor... Pray for us
