26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C



Dear Friends in Christ, riches are God's gifts that should be used wisely and be shared equitably. They are blessings given for the betterment of humanity and not for our selfish benefits. This is the central lesson of the readings of this Sunday. The prophet Amos in the

first reading chides those who seek wealth at the expense of the poor. Those who spend their time and their money on themselves alone. These will be punished by God because they do not care for their poor and suffering brothers and sisters. Jesus gives similar warning in today's gospel pointing to the destiny of the rich man who neglected his duty to show mercy to poor Lazarus.

Many people may be wondering why the rich man had to go to hell. We are not told he acquired his wealth by foul means, nor that he was responsible for the poverty and misery of Lazarus. In fact, there was no mention that Lazarus begged from him and he refused to help. We are not told he committed any crime or evil deed. All that was said is that he was feeding and clothing himself well as any other successful human being has a right to do. Why then did he go to hell? The problem why the rich man went to hell has a lot to do with what we think sin is. We often think that we sin only by thought, word and deed. We forget a fourth and very important way through which we sin, namely, by omission. In the "I Confess" we say these words: "I have sinned through my own fault, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do." Yet how readily we forget the sin of omission. So the rich man failed to exercise the virtue of charity.

Knowing our obligation to charity, Pope Francis said: "Christians cannot stand with arms folded in indifference or thrown up in the air in helpless resignation". As believers, we must stretch out our hands as Jesus does with us, freely and lovingly offering help to the poor and all those in need. In doing this, we put our faith to action and help in alleviating the plight of the needy in our world. The poor are right at our doorstep. We cannot help them all, but we can help some. As Pope Francis reminds us, "pray for the grace to hear the cries of all the poor". We all must take the time to listen to that cry first and then try to respond to it. We must always remember St Theresa of Calcutta who felt a call to help those who were poor. Thus, I end with her quote: "I see Jesus in every human being. I say to myself, this is hungry Jesus, I must feed him. This is sick Jesus. This one has leprosy; I must wash him and tend to him. I serve because I love Jesus."


