28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

Dear friends, gratitude as Thomas fuller said, "is the least of all the virtues but ingratitude is the worst of all vices". In the scriptures, God laments over man's ingratitude (Isaiah 1:2-4, John 1:11) and urges all to give thanks to the Lord for his great gifts (Psalm 107:1, John 11:41, Eph. 5:20, Col. 3:17). This Sunday liturgical readings invite us to be thankful. The first reading presents the story of the healing of Naaman, the army commander of the King of Aram, (in present-day Syria) who was healed of his leprosy by Yahweh the God of Israel and in the gospel, we read about the healing of the ten lepers by Jesus in which only one came back to thank him.

These two great healing stories have certain similitude as noted by the Fathers of the Church. First, both men healed were foreigners who sought healing from a Godly Jew. Second, they were both ordered to perform a small, seemingly irrelevant action (Elisha told Naaman to bathe in the river Jordan seven times. Jesus told the ten lepers to show themselves to the priest who could certify a healing) thus, in both stories, healing took place only after they left and obeyed instructions given. Third, both Naaman and the Samaritan returned to praise God. So in all, both appreciated the grace, which is the healing they received.



The lessons we should draw from these are: (1) As sinners, we need healing from the Master Healer - Jesus. Sin is like Leprosy, it makes us unclean and destroys our souls. We need divine healing to reinstate and cleanse us. Jesus our Savior heals us from this leprosy of sin. Since Jesus is not afraid to touch our deepest impurities, let us not hide

them. Just as the lepers cried out to Jesus for healing, let us also ask Him to heal us from the spiritual leprosy of sins including impurity, injustice, hatred and prejudice. (2) We should not grow tired of asking for divine healing for our body and soul as the Lord has given us the liberty to "ask, seek and knock" (Matt 7:7) (3) We need to learn to be thankful to God and to others whenever we receive any gift, for gratitude begets more blessings and encourages the giver to give more. Often, we allow the negatives of our lives to hide from us the blessings we have received - minor negatives like come and mark this tragic milestone. Assemble at some health problems, financial worries, conflict with a George Square from 6pm with Rosary at 6.30pm folneighbor or co-worker or spouse could divert our heart from appreciating the gifts we received from God. (4) The holy Eucharist is the supreme thanksgiving and so we must celebrate it actively, consciously and fruitfully. So, I conclude with the words of Johanes A Gaetner "to speak gratitude is courteous and pleasant, to enact gratitude is generous and noble, but to live gratitude is to touch Heaven."

Always be grateful and whenever you receive any gift, never forget to say "Thank You".
