33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Dear friends, one of the most debated issues in the world and specifically in Religion is the question of the Parousia that is the Second coming of Christ which according to biblical teaching will mark the end of the world. Many people both religious and secular scholars have predicted certain dates which in the long run are now démodé. We can recall the predictions of: Nostradamus, Stephen Hawkins, 2012 Maya apocalypse prediction, Harold Camping, to mention but a few. All these have not been able to localize and concretely state the right date and way this all-important event will come to pass. The readings this 33rd Sunday resonate this all aged questioned fact "When will the end of the world be?"

The Prophet Malachi in the first reading announces the coming of the day of the Lord. The prophet paints two pictures: the fate of the evil doer, and the triumph of the righteous who endures till the end. This short reading simply serves as an encouragement to us to continue our good work in patient righteousness and endurance. In order words, it teaches that to persist in good works till the end, one must endure all forms of trials and difficulties as the saints. We cannot just sit and wait for eternity. There is no need to stop fulfilling our daily duties, as some Christians in Thessalonica were doing. They had stopped working, waiting for the end of the world, and preaching the same to others, confusing them and causing a lot of disturbance. Paul had to intervene and warn them in very strong words: "In the Lord Jesus Christ, we urge and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat" (2Thess 3:12). Paul gives a reason for this command, "About the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, brothers, and our being gathered to him: please do not be too easily thrown into confusion or alarmed by any manifestation of the Spirit ... " (2Thess 2:1-2).

Jesus in the gospel reading talks about the impending crisis in terms of the challenges and adversities that his disciples must be prepared to face. Metaphorically, he speaks of the destruction of the old temple which will be a catalyst for a new Israel. The crisis that the death of the old will create will also bring believers an opportunity to bear witness to the new. The end time is not doom and gloom for those who believe. In fact, it can also be the blessing in disguise, the moment of purification and maturity of faith. So, how do we prepare for it? By living an exemplary life trusting in God and be actively involved in evangelical work via heroic witnessing.

Friends, the second coming of Jesus, the end of the world, transcends the logic of human history. We don't know when, how, or why Jesus will come. We can't figure out a date, nor should we. The point is that it *will* come, and *is coming*, and we are called to prepare. This we must do with faith and hope express in charity. Have a blessed Sunday!!
