31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

Dear Friends, God's love is unconditional, universal and all-inclusive. He loves us despite of our rejection of him through our sins. In God we see in completion the whole qualities of LOVE which St Paul enumerated in his first letter to the Corinthians "Love is patient and kind, does not keep record of wrongs, love never gives up" (1Cor 13:4-8) God never give up on us. He waits for us patiently and is eager to welcome us back when we stray.

The first reading reminds us that God's Almighty Power is shown in His Love and mercy. That is why God, who created the universe mercifully, waits for sinners to repent. God continues to love us, even when we do not love Him in return. The reading focuses on the love God has for all He has created, the love that overlooks sin so that we all have time for repentance. God shows us His redemptive love through His mercy. In the Responsorial Psalm (Ps 145), the Psalmist also tells us that the Lord is good to all, and His compassion is over all that He has made. The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness (Ps. 148:8). While St Paul in the second reading encourages the Thessalonians to persevere in their faith as they wait for the second coming of Jesus



The encounter between Jesus and Zacchaeus marks the high point of the central theme of this Sunday's readings 'Love and Mercy". Zacchaeus as the evangelist described him, is not just a tax collector but the head of the tax collectors. If tax collectors are known as "public Sinners" what appellation fits

the one who is in-charge of them? Zacchaeus then deserves to be called 'the worst public sinner'. Thus, knowing his state, he sought to see Jesus but his height remained a barrier. To overcome this, he Climbed the Sycamore tree in order to catch a glimpse of the one his heart desires. As Zacchaeus despite his sins opened his heart to God's Mercy, everything in him changed. There erupted instantaneous changes in his life orientations and values (Luke 19: 8); subsequently, these changed his destiny 'today salvation has come to this house..." (Luke 19:9-10).He realized the worthlessness of the treasures of the world

So friends, as sinners, we need to accept God's invitation to repentance. Just like Zacchaeus, our willful acceptance and search for reconciliation with God and our brothers and sister is imperative in our mission as Christians. God's mercy abounds, let us run to Him always and live like Him in faithful kindness and unfathomable generosity to one another in love. Have a great Sunday!
