2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR A

Dear friends, as Virginia Woolf rightly said "Every secret of a writer's soul, every experience of his life, every quality of his mind, is written large in his works". We see this in John the Baptist who features prominently in today's gospel. Each vear on the second Sunday of advent we meet John the Baptist preaching in Judea calling all to repentance (Matt 3:1-12). St John the Baptist has a prominent role in the Adventus Domini. He is the voice that cries in the wilderness "Prepare the way for the Lord, make his paths straight" (Mk 1: 3, Diocesan Courage Apostolate for Catholics with Same Matt 3: 3, Isaiah 40:3). In this, we see the soul of the prophet and the mind of God for his people whom He calls through His prophets and now from the precursor John the Baptist who calls us all to repentance. "Repentance' is an unattractive idea. It conjures up morose brooding over past sins and failures". But this is not what John the Baptist proclaimed. His message was wholly positive. John calls us all to repentance, conversion and renewal (to change our ways, our scale of values, our whole direction of life). This will enable all to act with justice and charity, letting our lives reflect the transfor- grow in Christian maturity. For information or advice mation that will occur when the Messiah comes.



The first reading describes how God will reform the lives of His Chosen People by sending the Messiah. Because of the bad example of the unfaithful successors of King David, the Chosen People were wavering in their loyalty to Yahweh. Hence, in the first reading, the Lord God, through His prophet,

Isaiah, tries to dispel their fears and to stir up hope among His people with His promise of a new Davidic King (a son of Jesse), who will establish peace and a glorious Kingdom of justice on earth (Isaiah 11:1-10). St Paul in the second reading, prays for the total reformation of the lives of the divided Christians in Rome; calling them to hope, love and unity as they wait for the coming of Christ.

This advent brothers and sister, let us harken to these calls to repentance and turn over a new leaf. May we never forget that salvation is God's doing, and at the same time our free choice. we cannot earn it as it is God's blessings, so we are saved by His grace. To be saved, we must cooperate with God's grace because God cannot force his bounty upon us. That is why John the Baptist in today's Gospel summons us to play our essential part by leading lives of repentance, conversion, and renewal, thus preparing the way for the Lord's second coming. We begin this process by spiritually preparing ourselves, as we reform and renew our lives by repentance and works of charity. Advent is the season of spiritual deepening and preparation through total renunciation of our sins, our watchful awareness through hope made manifest in charity and love for God and our neighbours. May the coming of Christ bring love, hope and peace to our troubled world.
