#### 3rd Sunday of Advent Year A

Dear friends, the third Sunday of advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. 'Gaudete' which is a Latin word meaning "rejoice", is taken from the opening antiphon: "Gaudete in Domino semper," i.e., "Rejoice in the Lord always." Why should we rejoice? We should rejoice because the savior's coming is near and we have gone half way in our preparation for his coming. This joyful spirit is made manifest by the lighting of the third candle of our Advent wreath, which is 'rose colored,' and the priest wears the 'rose colored' vestments, is what should accompany our prayerful preparing for the coming of the Prince of Peace. Rose colour use this Sunday represents a lightening of the dark violet of the rest of the penitential season of Advent. They remind us of the color of the sky at the very brink of morning, when the

sun is just beginning to come up. The horizon takes on a pale rose color that gradually gets redder and brighter as the sun rises. For faithful Christians, life is like a "long sunrise," and death is the entrance into the bright, "everlasting day" of eternal life. This is the reason why this Sunday is also called "Rose Sunday."



The first reading brings out clearly the theme of today's celebration. The desert and the parched land will exult; the steppe will rejoice (Isaiah 35:1). When there is no joy, life is like desert; life is like parched land; life is like steppe (barren land). Life without joy is like eyes that are blind, ears that are deaf and legs that are lame. It is the same joy the savior has come to bring and truly flows wherever Jesus goes. To those John the Baptist sent to ask him if he is the Christ, Jesus says "Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me." (Matthew 11:2) this fulfills the prophecy of Isaiah – the passage we heard in the first reading.

This Sunday dear friends, we are called to show to others the impact of our experience with the Lord. The ways that our lives reflect the Gospel message speaks volumes to the world about the ways the Lord is here now in our lives. Even on a deeper level we can demonstrate who we are waiting for during this Holy Season of Advent by the actions we do in Jesus' name, most particularly in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. As St. Teresa of Avila would say, "Christ has no body on earth now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which Christ's compassion is to look out to the earth. Yours are the feet by which He is to go about doing good and yours are the hands by which He is to bless us now." Let's share the joy with others, "Rejoice in the Lord always again I say rejoice, the Lord is near"!
