4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR A



As we draw near to the great day of the Lord's nativity, the signs are becoming clearer and definitive. How swift the season of Advent has gone? Are we really prepared to welcome Christ? Nevertheless, whether we are ready or not, we have the significant

signs and the prophet Isaiah in the first reading gives a sign from God "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel, which means God is with us" (Isaiah 7:14). This prophecy is considered as one of the most descriptive and definite prophecies foretelling the future Messianic King, the Christ, to be born as a descendant of David. This is reaffirmed in the second reading by St Paul as he asserts that Jesus was a descendant of David and thus the Messiah: "from David according to the flesh" (Rom 1:3). Paul explains Dinner/Dance to raise funds for the Diocese of Paisley Jesus, was revealed and established by the Father as Son of God in power by his resurrection from the dead. Then Paul provides a sweeping summary of God's mighty acts in history through Jesus Christ.

However, the definitive aspect of this sign is seen in the gospel reading which gave an explicit account of how Christ came to be born. The evangelist Mathew reminds us that the signs that God gave to us through the prophets, (that is, the signs which are the foundation of our hope this season), are not flatus vocis (empty words); but they are true and fulfilled in Christ. This could not have been without the humble cooperation of Joseph "The foster father of Jesus". for in order that Jesus could fulfil the Messianic prophecy given by Isaiah, Joseph had to accept Jesus as his son, making Jesus a legal descendant of David because Joseph was a descendant of David. What a wonderful man Joseph was. He is a perfect example for all humanity.

Like Joseph we are called to trust God, listen to Him and be faithful to Him. No matter what we face in life, we should never forget that God has a plan for every situation. If we need to experience the joy of the presence of Emmanuel, we must be ready to make sacrifices - be a gift to others. As in the words of Fr Anthony Kadavil "The greatest gift we can give to those we love, is to have faith in them, believe in their dreams, and try to help them realize them. We need to believe in the dreams of our husband, wife, children, parents, heroes, leaders and friends, then try our best to help them realize those dreams". May Christ bless us with His presence and grace every home with his Love...Amen. Merry Christmas in advance!!!
