1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR A

Dear Friends, we begin the church's new liturgical year "Year A" with the season of Advent which is a season filled with preparations and expectations. The word Advent is from the Latin root "ad venio" meaning "to Come". Thus, advent in its ecclesiastical use is the liturgical season anticipating the Adventus Domini, the "coming of the Lord." While the days grow shorter and colder here in Scotland, we prepare to welcome the "Sun of Justice" who comes to kindle our hearts with his light, warmth and love. The Eternal Word, who is outside of time, became Incarnate in time, thereby making all time sacred. In this holy season, as everyone is getting ready for Christmas - shopping and decorating, baking and cleaning. Too often, however, we are so busy with the material preparations that we lose sight of the main reason for our activity: "the Word made flesh coming to dwell among us" (John 1:14). We are urged to preserve the spiritual focus of Christmas amidst the prevailingly secular and consumer-driven society.

The readings this first Sunday of advent invite us to stay 2020 will be announced before the end of the year awake as we prepare for the coming of Christ. The prophet Isaiah in the first reading, describes his prophetic vision of all nations making a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, affirming their Faith in the one true God (Isaiah 2:1-5). St Paul in the second reading exhorts the Roman Christian community to get ready to meet Jesus in his Second Coming by freeing themselves from readings for Advent. All welcome. Tea afterwards in their former pagan tendencies toward excessive drinking, the hall sexual promiscuity, jealousy and rivalry, thus discharging their duties properly (Romans 13:11-14). We, too, are challenged to make spiritual preparations for Christ's birth in our lives. Jesus Christ in the gospel reading warns us of the urgency of vigilant preparation on our part that we may meet him as our Judge both at the end of our lives on earth and on the day of the Last Judgment when he comes in his glory (Matt.24:37-44). Jesus reminds us of how the unrepentant and ill-prepared evil people were destroyed by the flood in the dorsed by the Holy See.
