2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A

With the feast of the Baptism of the Lord we have entered into the liturgical time that we call "ordinary." On this second Sunday, the Gospel presents to us the scene of the meeting between Jesus and John the Baptist at the Jordan River. John the Baptist sees Jesus, who steps forward from the crowd and, inspired from above, points him out as the Messiah with these words: "Behold the lamb of God, he who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29). The word that is translated with "take away" literally means Dinner/Dance to raise funds for the Diocese of Paisley "to relieve," "to take upon oneself." Jesus has come into the Pilgrimage to Lourdes: Saturday 22nd February 2020, world with a precise mission: to free it from the slavery Greenock Town Hall, 7pm (for 7.30pm). Tickets cost £35 of sin, taking humanity's faults upon himself. (2Cor. (includes 3 course meal, fizz on arrival and live band). 5:19) In what way? By loving. There is no other way to defeat evil and sin than with the love that moves one to

give the gift of his life for others. In the testimony of John the Baptist, Jesus is given the traits of the Servant of the Lord, who "has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows" (Isaiah 53:4), to the point of dying on the cross. He is the true Passover lamb, who immerses himself in the river of our sin, to purify us.



The Prophet Isaiah in the first reading speaks of the "suffering servant" who will liberate the Jews. (Isaiah 49:3, 5-6). This the second of the "suffering servant" prophecies, found in Isaiah. These prophecies were uttered during the Babylonian exile to encourage the Jewish exiles to persevere in their trust in Yahweh, who would soon liberate them from Babylon, and eventually send them the long-expected Messiah, promised to Mass at UWS: weekday and Sunday Mass are now on, Abraham. St Paul in the second reading shows forth this same prophecy as fulfilled among the pagans highlighting the purpose of the coming of the Messiah - for the sanctification and true enlightenment of all nations (1 Corinthians 1:1-3).

Dear friends, today's readings offer us an eloquent example to imitate, so that we can also become Christ's authoritative witnesses. A believer can only give an authoritative witness if it coexists in perfect harmony with two of the Baptist's evangelical qualities. Firstly, knowledge of Christ that is cultivated through prayer, the sacramental and ecclesial life, reading good books and staying in edifying friendships. Secondly, the constant attributes of a 'bridegroom's friend' who goes in search of the Groom through the virtue of humility because always, in everyone's life, Christ must increase and we must decrease! Let us bear witness to Christ as St John the Baptist did for testifying with our life makes us more joyful.
