

Dear brothers and Sisters,

I know it's a difficult moment now and the Bishops have taken a wise step to suspend all public masses. This is to save lives as you know that Christ has come to give us life and in full (John 10:10). It is obvious that this epidemic Covid-19 that has turned pandemic has brought changes to every aspect of our lives. Our daily activities have been put on hold, the system has totally changed, For the Attention of All Church Volunteers with PVG Cer- Jobs, schools, church activities, social gatherings, even friendly visits have been suspended. There is fear everywhere and many are now wondering what the future holds. This is a sad and precarious moment which ordinarily breeds fear but let's not forget that our God is bigger than the situation. Nevertheless, this period allows us time to reflect on the essence of life and to learn that nothing is indispensable, that life is the highest value and that everything in life can be put on hold just to save it. So, let us make the best of this moment by taking the necessary precautions we need to remain healthy and making our stay at home more promising through mutual sharing of love.

I keep remembering you in my private prayers and masses, as I request you pray for me and for one another.
