Jesus takes advantage of the malicious question in order to teach an important lesson, rising above the polemics and the alliance of his adversaries, thus proffering a balanced solution which encapsulates His mission and the very obligations of every Christian - obedience to God and to the local authorities. Making clear this mission, Pope Francis encourages Christians thus "Christians are called to commit themselves concretely in the human and social spheres without comparing "God" and "Caesar"; comparing God and Caesar would be a fundamentalist approach. Christians are called to commit themselves concretely in earthly realities, but illuminating them with the light that comes from God. The primary entrustment to God, and hope in him do not imply an escape from reality, but rather the diligent rendering to God that which belongs to him. This is why a believer looks to the future reality, that of God, so as to live earthly life to the fullest and to meet its challenges with courage".

As we take up our daily obligations this week, may we seek to better our faith and thus enrich our society. Putting into action the words we have heard "the Good News" which St Paul reassures us that it is "power ... and ... holy Spirit" that is given to strengthen our faith. May the Virgin Mary help us to always live in conformity with the image of God that we bear within us, inside, also offering our contribution to the building of the earthly city.
