1st SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR B



Dear friends in Christ, Advent begins the Church's new year. It is a season of hopeful preparation for the coming Messiah. A time of Preparation extending over four Sundays before Christmas. The word ADVENT comes from the Latin ad venio "to come to" and adventus,

"coming" or "arrival". So, we prepare for the Adventus Domini, the "coming of the Lord" which we will celebrate at Christmas (His incarnation), waiting for His second coming (Parousia), as we daily encounter Him in our day Missio Scotland is the Scottish branch of the Catholic to day living.

The central theme of today's readings is Jesus' warning in guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come" (Mk 13:33). There is no time to waste for no one knows when the Master of the house will return. The prophet Isaiah in our first reading prays for God's active presence so that the post-exilic Israelites may be ready at all times. This reading is taken from the latest part of the Book of Isaiah. After the return to Jerusalem from exile in Babylon, the Jews passionately waited for the coming of the Messiah. They were conscious that they had sinned and deserved their punishment, but still longed for the liberation from foreign interference which the Messiah would bring. St Paul in the second reading exalts the young community of Christians at Corinth to keep aglow their faith so that they will not be "without any of the gifts of the spirit while you are waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed" (1Cor. 1:5).

So, as we begin this holy season of hopeful preparation, we must put into practice in our lives, these maxims of Christ 'stay awake' 'be on your guard' 'stay at alert'. They should be our advent projects. As people who wait for the coming of their master, we must be spiritually watchful and wakeful in our preparation. To do this, we must do the following: first, we must watch and pray: Our vigil for the coming of the Master must be an active-spiritual vigil as Jesus instructs us "Pray always and never relent" (Lk 18:1). Secondly, we must get rid of Sin in our lives: Sin is always a dividing factor between us and God. The prophet Isaiah says "surely the arm of the Lord is not too short to save, nor His ear too dull to hear. But your iniquities have built barriers between you and your God and your sins have hidden His face from you so that He does not hear" (Is. 59:1-2) and lastly we must use the gifts we have received from the spirit to serve others (1Peter 4:10-11). This way, we actively wait in hope for the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (Titus 2:13) to the glory of God the Father; to him be the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen. Have a great Sunday!!
