#### 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR B

Dear friends, as the great feast of the Lord's Nativity draws near, the liturgy of the word this Sunday, reveals to us the wonderful surprises and their accompanied joys that supervene this feast - birth of Christ. We can only experience these if we just like Mary or King David allow the will of God to be done in our lives.

We see in our first reading, King David who lived about 1000 years before Christ, wanted to build a worthy dwelling place for God because God had already done so many surprising things in his life. But for this gener- Missio Scotland is the Scottish branch of the Catholic osity of David, God surprised David with an unimaginable promise. God tells him, that instead of David building a house for Him, He would build a house for David, a dynasty and a kingdom that would last forever. The Messiah, the Son of God would be his descendant and therefore his dynasty and his kingdom would last forever. Mary in today's Gospel gave herself to God when she received the message at the annunciation. With her fiat, she entered into a partnership with God, in God's salvific mission. Thus, St Luke in today's Gospel reminds us that God's promise is best fulfilled not in buildings, or even in great kings like David, but rather in humble souls like Mary who trusted in God's promise. Ruminating on these special promises St Paul glorifies God for fulfilling these mysteries in Christ. Explaining further St Paul affirms that the unveiling of God's plan for human salvation has been done through Jesus.

So dear friends, as we conclude this season of Advent, may we keep to mind that the spirit of advent consists largely in living close to our blessed mother Mary who during this time is carrying the child Jesus in her womb. We can think of the whole of our life as somewhat longer advent, a time of waiting for that definitive moment when we will at last find ourselves with God forever. There is no better way of preparing for Christmas, than by keeping company with Mary - the handmaid of the Lord, getting to know her and deepening our love and trust in her. Mary imparts joy to our souls as we await in faith and hope for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. May we learn true obedience from Mary who entrusts herself unconditionally to God and through her may we learn that God has a plan for every one of us. So, like Mary, may we co-operate to this plan

by entrusting to Him our whole life. May we make Mary's prayer ours and recite it daily, Fiat! "I am the handmaid of the Lord... let what you have said be done to me" (Lk.1:38) Have an awesome Sunday as we await the birth of Christ.

# <u>Celebrating Christmas Day over the Christmas</u> Octave

For Catholics Christmas is not just 25 December but the Church's liturgy extends it over an Octave of eight days that prolong the solemnity of Christmas Day. The Christmas Octave lasts from Christmas Day until 1 January when we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Every day within the octave is treated the same as the original feast day of the Nativity of our Lord with the Gloria repeated. This is because the great feasts of our redemption cannot be grasped in a single celebration and need a full week to consider the mystery. In Scriptures the number eight represents perfection and rest. So, we would encourage you during Covid restrictions to book to come to Mass on any of those days, knowing that you are truly still celebrating Christmas Day.
