

2ND SECOND OF ADVENT YEAR B

Dear friends, every second Sunday of advent, the Church presents to us an important figure – John the Baptist, the last of the prophets – who leads us on pilgrimage to the Jordan River, so that we might be made ready for Christ. John as St Mark describes in today's gospel is "the voice that cries in the wilderness" (Mk 1:3), "proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" (Mk 1:4). One special thing we must point out here about the Gospel of St Mark is that the author already knows who Jesus is: "The son of God" (Mk. 1:1). Thus, he tells us that "the story of Jesus did not begin with his birth on earth but began in the mind of God from the beginning of times. This shows us that the advent of Jesus must be understood as a part of God's saving plan. God fulfilled the plan He had for us when creation began. He raised us to the dignity of divine son-ship by the incarnation and made us inherit the Kingdom of God". So, today's periscope could be seen as a well-researched and properly documented account, as he merges Exodus 23:20, Malachi 3:1 and Isaiah 40:3 in his presentation of the ingress of the precursor of Christ and his role in relation to Jesus.

Arrayed in the proper order, the first reading from the prophesy of Isaiah is the joyful song which opens the second part of Isaiah-Deutero-Isaiah. After the 70 years of the Exile Israel is looking forward to the return to Jerusalem, aware that they are soon to be released from their captivity. They have 'served their sentence' in Babylon and their sin has been forgiven. The Lord will lead them in joy across the great desert as he led them across the desert at the Exodus, and will manifest his glory again. St Peter in the second reading explains why the expected second coming of Christ has not yet occurred "but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways" (2Peter 3:).

What then must we do in order to be ready for Christ? John preached that the appropriate behavior for those preparing "the way of the Lord" was to be baptized "as they confessed their sins." He wanted the Jews to prepare their lives for the Messiah by filling in the valleys of prejudice, leveling the mountains of pride and straightening out their crooked paths of injustice and immorality. May we harken to these as we wait in hope for the coming of Christ. We need to become both preachers and doers of the good news following the example of St John the Baptist; imitating him in his humility and simplicity. This season of advent should be a time of introspective reflection and preparation in order to that Jesus will be reborn in us. Something new must be seen in our lives by those around us by our sharing love, unconditional forgiveness, compassion and merciful. May we accept the challenge of St John the Baptist to turn this advent season into a real spiritual "homecoming" by making our heart a worthy Manger for Christ.

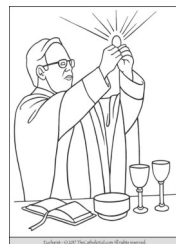

OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS' GROTTTO/ MEMORIAL WALL

It is the intention of the Parish to create a Memorial Wall containing the names of deceased relatives and friends of our parishioners. The wall will flank the newly acquired beautiful statue of Our Lady at the rear garden area of the Church. The names of our loved ones will be etched onto terracotta red brick tiles and applied to the existing wall.

Financing of the bricks will be through sponsorship, on which hopefully, we will be able to claim gift-aid from the government for any UK taxpayers. However, if you are not a taxpayer, you can still purchase bricks. There are two sizes of brick available;

1. single brick with two lines containing 16 characters per line maximum E.g. in loving memory (16) of John Smith (13).
2. double brick with 4 lines of 16 characters per line maximum.

Please note on both types of brick, a space counts as a character.

£20 per single brick
£30 per double brick
