FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD YEAR B

We celebrate today the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. It is a special feast the relates the manifestation of God (Christ) to the world represented by the visit of the Magi, guided by the star. This ancient feast celebrates the fact that Israel's Messiah is also the savior of the entire world. This is of immense wonder (a mystery) and gratitude for the non-Jews (Gentiles) that the expected messiah is the savior of the whole world. The word Epiphany comes from the Greek *Epiphaneia* which means striking appearance, apparition or show-forth, revelation or manifestation. With this significant event, God shows or manifest that He is the God of both Jews and Gentiles (Gal.3:28), God of the universe.

The first reading today uses the image of "the break of dawn "the prophet Isaiah calls out Jerusalem to "arise and shine for your light has come" (Is 60:1). This time in Israel's history was a thrilling moment when the people had returned from exile in Babylon and were beginning to have a globalized idea of the world but with specific pride of place of Jerusalem as the hub where Carmel and exotic nations throng to. St Paul in our second reading explicitly speaks of this revelation or manifestation (Epiphaneia) as the mystery that was hidden (unknown) to men in the past but has been revealed through the spirit "that Pagans now share the same inheritance... they are part of the same body .. same promise in Jesus Christ through the gospel" (Eph3:2-3). This great secret "mystery" has been revealed in Christ. The gospel reading presents three important facts about this great event. First, it relates how it happened and then highlights the bitter reaction of Herod who resolutely schemed to exterminate the newly born king. Second, it shows forth the wisdom of God through His guidance and revelation to the Magi the wicked intent of Herod and He warned them not to go back to Him, but to return home through a different way (Matt. 2:12). And lastly the symbolic gifts the Magi offered to Christ-Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh.

So, what are the lessons today? First, that salvation is a free gift of God to all "to all who received him - those who believe in his name - he has given the right to become God's children" (Jn. 1:12). Second, the light of Christ has come to illumine the darkness in our world. Christ is the light of the world (Jn. 8:12) and whoever follows him will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life (Jn. 8:12) but he that rejects Him is already condemned (Jn. 3:18). Lastly, we must act like the Magi, following Christ's light, though there may be moments of obscurity, doubts, and tribulations. But "let not your hearts be troubled" (Jn. 14:1). So dear friends, let us follow

Christ in this New Year, and with joy offer him ourselves. May we be drawn closer to the author of love and learn from him to live and work together in love as brothers and sisters. Seeing the star today, may we set out with our gifts and give € freely in love (Matt 10:8). Happy New Year!!!
