5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

Dearly beloved in Christ, oftentimes we are tormented by suffering, sickness, hardship and misfortune just as job was. Job lost everything and, in his misfortune, he saw no reason for life. He became melancholic and lamented over everything. Job complains of the tedium and futility of life and the miseries of human existence. Job's psychological disposition could be the same with ours during this time of crisis. Job's pessimistic view about life in our first reading relays the painful picture of the sick person's frustration, the slow and pointless passage of time, the crazy, distorted imaginings. Job feels that God is oppressing him, but yet Missio Scotland is the Scottish branch of the Catholic clings to God as his one hope of release. We see a contrast of this in Jesus, the suffering servant of God, who takes to himself the sufferings of others (Isaiah 53).

Today's readings challenge us to avoid Job's pessimistic and desperate view of life as a chain of pain and sufferings. To accept life with hope and optimism as a precious gift from God, using it to do good for others and spending our time, talents and treasures for the good of others as Jesus did as can be seen in today's gospel reading (Mark 1:29-39). The snippets gathered in the gospel reading give us a sample of Jesus' activity at Capernaum, the little fishing village on the edge of the Lake of Galilee: healing and prayer. The first incident, the healing of the relative of his friend and follower Simon Peter, reminds us that Jesus does respond if we pray for the needs of our nearest and dearest. Then the summary of his evening activity shows his concern to bring healing and wholeness.

So, just like Jesus, every Christian is called to follow his example - doing good and helping those in need. We are called to take care of one another. Doing good always and avoid harming others. we can harm or heal those around us in so many ways. It does not need to be a miracle! A greeting, a look, a smile, a touch can bring the peace of Christ to someone in desperate need of reassurance and no less can they harm and wound. But the third little story, of Jesus going off to pray in the early morning, shows that the well-spring of all his activity was his union with the God whom he called his Father. We cannot say what Jesus' prayer was, any more than I can say what your prayer is, but the confident communication between Father and Son must have been the source of his strength and compassion.

So dear friends as we poised to begin this new week, may imitate Christ by caring for those in need, doing good and never forget to rededicate our families, friends and even those we call our enemies in prayers. So, the watch words this week are: Love, Heal, Care and Pray. Have a wonderful Sunday!!
