
3RD SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR B

Dear brothers and sisters, one of the sole purposes of this season of lent is to enable all Christians to reexamine our lives and cleanse our faults. This is important because "an unexamined life is not worth living". Observing this in this holy season, the readings of this Sunday give us the road map for proper spiritual cleansing. In the first reading, we read the moral code - the commandment - given by God to Moses for his people. This was given to enable harmony in the society and for the personal well-being of God's holy people. The law - decalogue - formed the foundation of the nation of Israel fulfilling the three essentials of any Missio Scotland is the Scottish branch of the Catholic nation which are: a common land, a common people, and common law or constitution. Observing the commandment was an essential obligation for every Jew. So, the law as St Paul said has become "our tutor to lead us to Christ, so that we may be justified by faith" (Gal. 3:24).

Jesus in the gospel reading enters and cleanses the temple (Jn. 2:13-25). His action simply demonstrates that He is God's wisdom and the fullness of the Law. His zeal distinguishes Him, from the authorities. Instead of representing God's interest, they represented their selfish economic and social interests. It also distinguishes Him from temple pilgrims who simply visited the temple without real devotion to God. Jesus' action was questioned by the people who saw it as being foolish or daft (John 2:13). But St Paul in the second reading makes it evident that "God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength" (1Cor 1:25) and the psalmist in today's responsorial psalm attests that the law of the Lord is perfect, the precepts of the Lord are right and the decrees of the Lord are truth (Ps 18)

spirit (1Cor. 6:19) and so we have no right to desecrate God's temple by our filthy practices of impurity, injustice, pride, hatred, or jealousy. May we ask for God's forgiveness through the sacrament of Reconciliation. Second, we must worship God in spirit and in truth. May we recognize the love the Father has lavished on us by letting us be called God's children (1In.3:1) and resolve to live in mutual love. May we respect and desire for the betterment of everyone with no thought of personal loss or gain. May we come back to the Lord our God with true penitential intents: fasting, weeping, and mourning (Joel 2:12). May our Lenten observances bring us true repentance and prepare us to rise to a new life with Christ on Easter...Amen.
