The apostle's choice of Mattias came by prayer submitting the process to the power of God and in Faith (Acts 1:20-26). This recourse to prayer as the only way and the true way came from Christ's teaching and its Christ's way.

So, what can we learn from today's liturgy of the word? Two important things which are: the need for prayer and the necessity of love which keeps us all in unity. As true disciples of Christ, we must learn to entrust everything to God through prayer. We must "always prayer and never relent" (Lk. 18:1). We need to understand, appreciate, cooperate and pray: The denominations are a reality. There is no use in our blaming each other for the historical events which caused these divisions in Christ's Body. What we can do is to learn sympathetically about the doctrinal similarities and differences to our own beliefs among Christian believers, to shed prejudices and suspicion about each other, to learn to love each person we encounter, and to cooperate with the members of all denominations in all ways possible. In love, we must pray for unity which surpasses a merely "Comfortable" notion of friendliness and cooperation but relying on the guidance of the holy spirit whose fire of love destroys every division and unites what was divided. Let us work and pray for unity in the world, in the church and in our community. Have a wonderful Sunday!!
