#### PENTECOST SUNDAY YEAR B



Dear friends in Christ, today we celebrate ne outpouring of the holy spirit on the disciples of Christ which marks the beginning of the Church. This great event happened on the day of Pentecost - fifty days after the resurrection of Christ. on this day, the promised advocate, the

Paraclete descended on the apostles and our blessed mother Mary in the form of tongues of fire and they spoke in different languages as the Spirit gave them. Ordinarily, Pentecost marks the definitive end of the Easter Season. It occupies a very important position in the Church's life and liturgical calendar I regret to inform you that as of 27 April 2021, for it marks the beginning of the church's missionary endeavour. It is a day of renewal and empowerment when the fearful disciples came out of their hiding and preached fearlessly to the people.

The readings today focused on the actions of the third person of the blessed Trinity - the Holy Spirit. Now the work of Jesus on earth has ended, the holy spirit initiates the evangelical mission of the church through the apostles. But who is the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit is the mutual love of the Father and the Son. The breath of the Lord and the one who sanctifies. The Holy Spirit empowers us, makes us strong Christians and soldiers of Christ (CCC 1302). This empowerment comes through the different gifts we receive from the Holy Spirit. Through them, we become bold to call God our Father (Rom 8:15), and above all, to proclaim to our world that, Jesus Christ is Lord. Also, the Holy Spirit helps us to bear good fruits in Christ (Gal 5, 22). He leads us into the kingdom of righteousness, peace and joy. He empowers us to go into our world to bring peace, unity, joy, love and salvation to nations. The first reading and the gospel reading explain the 'how' of the event. While the second reading speaks of the varied gifts of the holy spirit and the unity of works done by and through the same spirit. The slightest glance around a church full of people is enough to show the variety within the Christian community. But it needs the hints given us by Paul to remind us that every member of that community has his or her own special gift to contribute. Mercifully, these gifts are all different but from the same source.

So dear friends, Pentecost is a special feast and a great occasion to orchestrate the different gifts we have received from the one spirit through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. We must seek a better means of putting them into use. Now the work of the church is evident and the demand of it is imminent, we must let ourselves be guided by the Holy Spirit who fortifies, protects and sanctifies us. Only the Holy Spirit can calm our fears and restore order to our lives. He alone can empower us to face the daily challenges of our lives, families, communities, and our world at large. He alone can give us the right insight we need to navigate through the complex moments of this life. May we be enabled by the Holy Spirit to be faithful witnesses of the gospel in the world. Happy Feast of Pentecost!!

### 20 Days for Life June 1st 2021 till June 20th 2021 8am until 8pm each day

Due to Tier 4 restrictions our 2021 Lenten 40 Days for Life peaceful prayer and fasting vigil at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital in Glasgow was postponed. Sadly, in the midst of this current situation the government did not halt or restrict its abortion culture of death.

On March 23<sup>rd</sup> 2021 the government called for a UK National Day of Reflection to be held for those who had died from Covid the previous year. According to latest official figures at that time there had been 143,259 Covid deaths. The following month April 2021 we marked the 53<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the implementation of the 1967 Abortion Act which has resulted in almost 9.5million deaths of our unborn children here in the UK.

Think of the unborn when you pray the words 'For what I have done and for what I have failed to do'. Think of those words in the ballot box. 'They will not grow old as we who are left grow old but we will remember them'.
