5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR B

Dear friends in Christ, this Sunday, Christ continues his teaching on himself. Last week he affirmed he is the good Shepherd who cares and protects his sheep (Jn. 10:11-18). This Sunday, he uses the image of the vine which traditionally is the symbol of Israel. It was used by Isaiah to express the Lord's complaint at the unresponsiveness of Israel (Isaiah 5.1-7). Prophet Ezekiel used it in his painstaking criticisms of the proud symbols of Israel (Ezekiel 15). Jesus in the parable of the Wicked Vine-dressers (Mark 12.1-12) used it to shame the irresponsible current leaders of Israel. In today's gospel which is the Last Supper discourse, the image of the vine acquires a new dimension, the pain of pruning As you begin considering how to vote please which Christ will experience at Golgotha. However, the core message here is not just on the vine but on the need to reabide in Christ in order to bear fruit.

fies to the abundance of spiritual fruits yielded by the apostles because of their close bond with the risen Lord. The reading tells us how the Lord pruned the former Pharisee, Saul of Tarsus, a fanatic who had persecuted the Church, to produce a fruit-bearing branch called Paul, the zealous Apostle to the Gentiles, entirely dedicated to the proclamation of the Gospel. Even Paul's forced return to Tarsus for a brief period is an example of God's pruning of the vine to bring forth a greater harvest, namely, the mission to the Gentiles. St John in the second reading explains that only if we remain united to Christ by putting our faith in him and drawing our spiritual strength from him, will we be able to obey God's commandments, especially the commandment of love, loving one another as Jesus commanded us. In the Gospel, Jesus reminds his disciples of the closeness of their relationship with him and the necessity of their maintaining it. They are not simply rabbi and disciples, rather their lives are mutually dependent - as close as a vine and its branches. By this, Jesus explains to them and to us what our relationship with him should be like.

Dear friends, to be true disciples of Christ, we must be one with him by abiding in him through prayers, frequent reception of the Sacraments especially the holy Eucharist and being in his presence. There is no midway to it, it is either we are in or out. So, there is no place for laxity or passiveness. We must be always active - no dull moment. Then, as the vine needs pruning for a fruitful harvest, so we have to be pruned in order to bear fruits. Pruning here implies cutting out of our lives everything that is contrary to the spirit of Jesus and renewing our commitment to the Christian ideals. It involves the practice of self-control over our evil inclinations, sinful addictions and aberrations. May we all be one with Christ the true vine and bear fruits of kindness, mercy, charity, and holiness.
