## 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

Dear friends, after the great feasts, we are back to the ordinary time of the season and straight away, Jesus plunges us back to his teaching of his kingdom - the kingdom of God whose sole mission is its establishment. The readings this Sunday brings to light his teaching on the mysteries of this kingdom. Theologically speaking, today's readings especially the first and the gospel readings using imageries (Parables/Allegories) focus our attention on the birth and growth of the reign or rule of God (Kingdom of God), in our human lives and on the gigantic growth of the Church from very humble beginnings. Both growths are slow and mysterious, guided by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In our first reading, the prophet Ezekiel speaks of the resurgence of a shoot from the highest branch of the cedar planted (Ez. 17:22-24). Theologically speaking, this is a tailpiece,



promising that Israel will again become a great cedar tree, in whose shade the nations will come to take shelter. Our today's gospel parables from St Mark account use the same figure of a great tree in which all peoples will shelter (Mk 4:26-34). Jesus compares the growth of the Kingdom of God to the germi-

nation of a wheat seed and that of a tiny mustard seed. Both have exceedingly small beginnings. The wheat seeds, by gradual but steady growth, help the farmer to get a bumper crop. In the same way, the life principle in a tiny mustard seed enables it to grow into a large bush. The reign of God in human hearts and the growth of the Church in the world also have small beginnings. But the Source of all life, God the Holy Spirit, gives to both a steady, persistent and gigantic growth, provided we, the members of the Church, cooperate with God's grace.

Our take-home messages today are: (a.) as the seeds need to be sown, there is the need for the little human effort (sowing the seed), to bring the good harvest. Jesus followers must do their best to plant the seeds so that the power of God can work on them. We must be active non-passive members of the kingdom of God. (b). We must realize that we are not the sole architect of the growth and so its fruitfulness is not by our making but by God's grace. God is the unseen source of the fruition of the seed. So, don't get discouraged rather be encouraged (c) while the human agent is seen at the beginning (sowing) and the end (harvesting), it does not imply that we are the sole owner of the kingdom, rather we called to participate to be part of the kingdom. So dear friends, the conviction that the growth of the Kingdom of God is the work of the Holy Spirit and needs our humble cooperation should make us optimistic in continuing our work of witnessing. We should continue sowing tiny seeds in the form of words of love, acts of encouragement, deeds of charity, mercy and forgiveness.

## 20 Days for Life June 1st 2021 till June 20th 2021 8am until 8pm each day

Due to Tier 4 restrictions our 2021 Lenten 40 Days for Life peaceful prayer and fasting vigil at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital in Glasgow was postponed. Sadly, in the midst of this current situation the government did not halt or restrict its abortion culture of death.

On March 23<sup>rd</sup> 2021 the government called for a UK National Day of Reflection to be held for those who had died from Covid the previous year. According to latest official figures at that time there had been 143,259 Covid deaths. The following month April 2021 we marked the 53<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the implementation of the 1967 Abortion Act which has resulted in almost 9.5million deaths of our unborn children here in the UK.
