Today we celebrate Christ's great gift to the world 'His true body and blood' given as food for the salvation of the world. It is the celebration of his abiding presence (real

presence) fulfilling his promise to be with us always till the end of time (Matt 28:20). This feast was introduced in the late 13th century to encourage the faithful to give special adoration to the Holy Eucharist. So, its celebration gives us an occasion to learn more about the importance and value of the "Real Presence" of Christ so that we may appreciate the Sacrament better and receive maximum benefit from it.

covenantal bond. The first reading while illustrating the covenant of God with the people of Israel made with the blood of animals by Moses, emphasizes it as a bond between God and his people that demands utmost adherence and faithful observance. The second reading from the letter to the Hebrews compares Jesus to the high priest of old but distinguishes Jesus as the perfect high hands rather "he entered once for all into the sanctuary not with the blood of goats or calves but with his own blood thus obtaining eternal redemption" (Heb.9:12). More so, in today's gospel, St. Mark tells the story of the Last Supper where Christ gave his body and blood to his disciple as a new and everlasting covenant (Mk.14:12-16, 22-26). Jesus' new covenant engages us in a new alliance and gives us new life. The story told in this reading is the warranty and guarantee that, each time we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we are bound anew into his covenant.

Therefore friends, today's celebration is a celebration of life, salvation and grace. The Holy Eucharist as the Church teaches "is the source and the summit of the Christian life... for in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself...the Eucharist is also the culmination both of God's action, sanctifying the world in Christ and, of the worship, men offer to Christ... In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith..." (CCC1324-5). So, when we share in the celebration of the Eucharist, we share in the life of Christ the head and, in the life of the Church, his body. As we celebrate this great feast of Faith, let us worship what St. Thomas Aguinas did not hesitate to call, "the greatest miracle that Christ ever worked on earth". Before the greatness of this mystery, let us exclaim with St. Augustine, "O Sacrament of devotion! O Sign of unity! O Bond of charity!" affirming this, we repeat St. Thomas Aguinas' prayer of devotion to the Blessed Sacrament: "O Sacrament most holy! O Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving be every

Due to Tier 4 restrictions our 2021 Lenten 40 Days for Life peaceful prayer and fasting vigil at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital in Glasgow was postponed. Sadly, in the midst of this current situation the government did not halt or restrict its abortion culture of death.

On March 23rd 2021 the government called for a UK National Day of Reflection to be held for those who had died from Covid the previous year. According to latest official figures at that time there had been 143,259 Covid deaths. The following month April 2021 we marked the 53rd anniversary of the implementation of the 1967 Abortion Act which has resulted in almost 9.5million deaths of our unborn children here in the UK.
