Dear Friends in Christ, today's readings remind us of the mission God has entrusted to us through the church - how we are to prepare for it, what we may encounter and how to handle it. Our call is to preach

the Good News of Jesus by bearing witness to God's love, mercy, and salvation, as revealed through Jesus: "God chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world." (Ephesians 1:4). To this mission, we have to give our entire being, whether accepted or rejected, our concern should be to do the work we have been called to do.



The first reading (Amos 7:12-15), warns us that our witnessing mission will be rejected, as happened to the Old Testament prophets like Amos. He was ordered by prophesying back to his own country, the Southern Kingdom of Judah. Since his message did not march with the popular empty flattering praises meant only to please the king. So, Amos was asked to leave. He was booted out of the national shrine and told to shove off home and mind his own business. Our Gospel reading shows the sending of the twelve Apostles (Mk.6:7-13). Their mission is to preach God's healing, kindness, forgiveness and mercy but they are to be witnesses (reason for sending them in pairs), they must rely on God's providence (reason for travelling light no food, haversack, spear tunic etc.) and must avoid unnecessary familiarities (reason to stay in one house). This mission however is not exempt from hardship and rejection (reason to shake off the dust of their feet). But in all, they are to be walking illustrations of God's love and providence in action.

Dearly beloved, God sends us today to be witnesses of his love in our world. Just like Amos and the apostles, he calls us to surrender all to him and preach his message of peace, love, repentance and healing to our world. Like the prophet Amos and the apostles, we must prepare ourselves for the demands of this mission – Acceptance and rejection, joys and sorrows, sacrifices, detachments and praises. May we be true disciples and apostles sharing in Christ's mission in order to bring many souls to heaven. Remember, we are called to share with others not just words, or ideas, or doctrines but an experience, — our experience of God and His Son, Jesus. Be the salt of the earth and the light of the world (Matt 5:13-16)
