**Jubilee - 2025:** Pope Francis proclaimed the 2025 Jubilee Year on May 9, 2024, with the papal bull *Spes non confundit*, which means "Hope Does Not Disappoint". The Jubilee Year will begin on Christmas Eve, 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica. Over the coming weeks and months, we'll be considering how can mark the Jubilee in our parish & cluster.

**Parish Stewardship:** First Collection & Second Collection - figures not available at time of printing. Thanks for your continuing generosity. Please note that collection figures do not include Standing Orders or online donations. Sunday - the Epiphany we have a Second collection for Justice & Peace. In 2024 our Justice & Peace collection raised £16,793 with an additional £1,373 from Gift Aid and £1,665 in interest, bringing total income to £19,831. In 2024 our total (draft) expenditure was £34,953 with £10,300 as our Diocesan pro-rata contribution to the National J&P work and £24,653 for the Scottish Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency. So, our costs in 2024 were £15,122 (76%) higher than our income. This collection helps fund our Scottish Catholic Justice and Peace Commission, our Marriage Tribunal and our Catholic Parliamentary Office. Our Justice & Peace Commission campaigns against renewal of Trident, for fairness for asylum seekers and refugees and for action against climate change and for the environment.

**SVDP:** All of the box income received by St. Mary's Conference over the festive period will be donated to the Special Works Conference at St. Vincent's Hospice in Howwood. Thank you in anticipation of your generosity.

St. Margaret's Children & Family Care: All donations to the Crib go to St. Margaret's Children & Family Care Society. the only Catholic adoption group left in the UK. This is their main way of raising funds for the year ahead.

**SAFEGUARDING:** Safeguarding in the Catholic Church means doing everything in our power to try and prevent abuse; firstly, by having a safe system of recruitment for clergy, religious, employees and volunteers; which includes PVG checks, references and training; and secondly, by having a reporting system so people can come forward with disclosures and concerns, be listened to and have their disclosures acted upon. Each Parish has a trained safeguarding co-ordinator. HELEN MCLAREN is the safeguarding co-ordinator in this Parish. Her role is to ensure that all parish volunteers who work with children and vulnerable adults are recruited safely and receive safeguarding training.
